cally. First and</p><p>foremost, both you and the other player are in blind positions , on
each hand.</p><p>The player</p><p>on the button also acts as the small blind, while the other player pay
s the big , blind.</p><p>Like in all other formats, the player with the button plays last on al
l following</p><p>streets but will act , first pre-flop.</p><p>As you are always in the blinds, and the number of</p><p>opponents is minimal, you have every reason to , play way more hands
than you would in a</p><p>ring game. In fact, in many heads-up matches, it is correct , to pla
y almost all hands</p><p>from the button and a very high percentage of hands in the big blind a
s , well.</p><p>While you</p><p>could previously profitably play various hands in position and wait to
