What is Single-Hand Blackjack?

Single-hand blackjack is a classical game

requiring you to wager on the single hand dealt to you from

one deck of 52 cards.

Therefore, you get one hand per round. This includes the fi

rst two cards you re dealt

with and any cards you receive later, no matter how many ca

rds you have in hand. The

game has traditionally had a lower house edge compared to other casino

games, however,

if the game only pays 6 to 5 on a blackjack the casino edge is much hi

gher.

Essentially, this variant forces you to play only one hand

per round.

What is

Multi-Hand Blackjack?

You can decide how many hands you receive when you play

multi-hand blackjack online. Some games allow you to play 1, 2, 3, 4,

or 5 hands per

round. Each hand is usually dealt with the same bet size, however, you

may find some

casinos that offer you the option of different bet sizes. F
