<p>croupier will exchange it for you. The croupier will deal two 💷

; cards face up to each</p>

<p>player and one to himself.</p>

<p>Count up the value of your two cards (cards count at 💷 their&l) Tj T* BT

<p>If your</p>

<p>first 2 💷 cards total 21 you have a Blackjack, a winning comb

ination that pays 3-2 as</p>

<p>long as the croupiers first card 💷 isn't an Ace. If this

is the case you will be offered</p>

<p>an insurance bet, equivalent to accepting even money 💷 straig

ht away.</p>

<p>If you don't have</p>

<p>Blackjack you can "Stand" or you can draw more cards, until

you believe your cards 💷 will</p>

<p>total closer to 21 than the croupiers.</p>

<p>You may "split" any pair for an additional</p>

<p>equivalent bet. Also, you may 💷 double your original bet and

draw only one more card with</p>

<p>any total from your first two cards.</p>

<p>If the croupier 💷 has a hand of 16 or under they</p>

<p>must draw more cards, with a hand of 17 or over they 💷 must s

tand.</p>

<p>If you don't have a</p>

<p>Blackjack but your hand is closer to 21 than the croupier s, you win e

ven 💷 money. If the</p>

<p>croupier s hand is closer, the house wins. If you match the croupiers

hand, you retain</p>
