&lt;p&gt;Associa&#231;&#227;o Ferrovi&#225;ria de Esportes, commonly referred to as simply Ferrovi&#225;ria, is a Brazilian association football club in Araraquara, S&#227;o &#129297; Paulo.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;They currently play in the S&#233;rie D, the fourth tier of Brazilian football, as well as in the Campeonato Paulista, &#129297; S&#227;o Paulo&#39;s premier state league.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;Founded on April 12, 1950, Ferrovi&#225;ria is the only Araraquara club to reach the Campeonato Paulista &#129297; first division.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;The club&#39;s best campaign in that competition was in 1959, when the club finished in the third position.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;It is &#129297; also the only club of the city to have competed in the Campeonato Brasileiro S&#233;rie B.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;The club competed in this &#129297; competition in 1995.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;They play in carmine shirts, white shorts and socks.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;History [ edit ]&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;The club was founded on April 12, &#129297; 1950, by engineers of Estrada de Ferro Araraquara (meaning Araraquara Railroad).&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;Ant&#244;nio Tavares Pereira Lima was chosen as the club&#39;s first &#129297; president.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;Initially the club&#39;s colors were to be blue and white, like the Rio de Janeiro city team.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;However, these colors were &#129297; not very popular, and were changed to carmine and white, like the Juventus ones.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;On May 13, 1951, the club played &#129297; their first match ever.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;The club beat Mogiana of Campinas 3 1.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;The club&#39;s first goal was scored by Fordinho in that match.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;On &#129297; May 20, 1951, the club played their second match, in Taquaritinga city.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;It was also the club&#39;s first defeat.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;Linense, of Lins, &#129297; beat Ferrovi&#225;ria 2 1.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;On June 10, 1951, Ferrovi&#225;ria&#39;s stadium, called Est&#225;dio Fonte Luminosa, was inaugurated.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;In the inaugural match, Vasco da Gama, &#129297; of Rio de Janeiro, beat Ferrovi&#225;ria 5 0.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;On July 1, 1951, Ferrovi&#225;ria played their first match against a club from the &#129297; same city.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;Ferrovi&#225;ria was defeated by Paulista (Araraquara) 4 0.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;On April 15, 1956, Ferrovi&#225;ria beat Botafogo of Ribeir&#227;o Preto 6 3 in the &#129297; Campeonato Paulista Second Division final stage (dispute) Tj T\* B&#97; the promotion to the following year&#39;s first division.&lt;/p&gt;  
&lt;p&gt;In the last match of the competition, Ferrovi&#225;ria beat Portuguesa
