Lowest to Highest Value Hands

High Card (Lowest Value) Tj T\* BT /F1 12 Tf 50 520 Td (Value)

When you have no card combinations, the highest card value in

your hand. Aces

are high in Poker.

One Pair

Two cards of the same value.

Two Pair

Two pairs of

different card values.

Three-of-a-Kind

Three cards of the same value.

Straight

Five

cards in order, such as 6 -7 -8 -9 -10 -J. The suits do not match.

Flush

Five cards of

the same suite.

The value of the Flush is determined by the

highest card in it. For

example, a Flush with a King as the highest value card would

beat a Flush with a Queen

as the highest value card.

Full House

Three cards of one value, and two cards of

another value. Full houses are considered "\_\_\_\_ full of \_\_\_\_"

where the first blank is

the set of three and the second blank is the pair. For example, a full

house

9 -9 -5 -5 -J would be called "nines full of fives"

the best full house that is

possible is A -A -K -K -J. Suits do not matter.

When comparing a full house to another

full house, the set of three is compared first. If both players have

the same set of

three, then the pairs are compared. If the pairs match as well,

then it is a tie.
