<p>Poker Stove for Mac</p>

<p>Poker Stove is not available for Mac, so we've made a similar product that works on your 7 , £ Mac...and it's free! Download PokerZebra now</p>

<p>Poker Stove is a popular Windows application that calculates the odds your poker hand will 7 , £ win. It allows you to compare your hand against one or more opponents. Each opponent can be assigned as specific 7 , £ hand, or a range of hands.</p>

<p>For example, Poker Stove will calculate your odds of winning when you have AK and 7 , £ your opponent has any pocket pair higher than pocket nines.</p>

<p>Poker Stove only exists for Windows. So we've created a similar 7 , £ program that works on your Mac. We call it PokerZebra. Think of it as PokerStove for Mac.</p>

<p>Here's why you should 7 , £ use PokerZebra as your Mac Poker Stove equivalent:</p>

<p>PokerZebra allows for "hand versus" calculations.</p>

<p>PokerZebra has a simple and clean user interface.</p>

<p>PokerZebra 7 , £ is fast, giving you the info you need in a hurry.</p>

<p>PokerZebra allows for up to 10 hand ranges in a 7 , £ single hand.</p>

<p>PokerZebra shows your hand equity.</p>

<p>PokerZebra uses an effective and accurate syntax for entering hands.</p>

<p>PokerZebra takes into account flop, turn, 7 , £ and river cards.</p>

<p>Using PokerZebra</p>

<p>Enter any board cards that are currently known, enter your hand, and enter your opponents' hands. Click 7 , £ on "Calculate", and PokerZebra does an exhaustive calculation of all possible outcomes. Calculating can take a long time so PokerZebra 7 , £ updates the odds regularly during the calculation. Possible outcomes are evaluated in a random order to make sure that the 7 , £ odds converge quickly to the final values.</p>

<p>Evaluating a hand against unknown hands</p>

<p>You can evaluate a hand against an opponent who 7 , £ has any two cards,

by using the word "random".</p>

<p>Putting a player on a range of hands</p>

<p>Specify a player's range of 7 , £ hands as follows:</p>

<p>enter "random" to include any hand</p>

<p>A specific hand: "Kh Qh"</p>

<p>A hand, without suit: for example, AK, or TT</p>

<p>A 7 , £ suited hand: AKs</p>

<p>An unsuited hand: AKo</p>

<p>an open range. "TT+" means all pocket pairs with tens or high
