Football fans can look forward to plenty more Premier League action live on TNT Sports throughout December, the festive period, and into the new year.

Then came Crystal Palace against Liverpool at Selhurst Park at 12:30 on December 9 with Harvey Elliott scoring a dramatic late winner as the Reds came from behind to win 2-1, with Mohamed Salah scoring his 200th goal for the club.

Cole Palmer's brace and Noni Madueke's strike sent Mauricio Pochettino's team in a 3-0 lead, before goals from Ross Barkley and Elijah Adebayo set up a nervy finish for the Blues in Bedfordshire.

Looking to next year, there will be a winter break of sorts with the players able to get some mid-season rest from January 13-20.

Fans of Sheffield United, Burnley and Luton Town will, of course, be able to watch their teams in Premier League action, with the Blades' clash at home to West Ham, and the newly-promoted showdown between the Clarets and Hatters set to be shown live in January.

New games have been announced for the end of January and the whole of February, including Chelsea travelling to Anfield to play Liverpool and Aston Villa's game against Newcastle United at Villa Park.

Everton will be shown live for two weeks running, with their matches at home to Tottenham Hotspur and away at Manchester City on February 3 and 10 respectively to be shown live.

Liverpool fans will be able to watch their team in action again when they face Brentford at the Gtech Stadium on February 17, while a tantalising match-up between Arsenal and Newcastle at the Emirates has also been selected for broadcast a week later.
